Proclamation of September as Attendance Awareness Month

WHEREAS good attendance is essential to student achievement and graduation, and we are committed to dedicating our resources and attention to reducing chronic absenteeism rates, with a focus starting as early as kindergarten, WHEREAS chronic absence – missing 10 percent or more of school for any reason including excused and unexcused absences, or just two of three days a month – is a proven predictor of academic trouble and dropout rates, WHEREAS improving attendance and reducing chronic absence takes commitment, collaboration and tailored approaches to particular challenges and strengths in each community, WHEREAS chronic absence predicts lower third-grade reading proficiency, course failure and eventual dropout, it weakens our communities and our local economy, WHEREAS the impact of chronic absence hits low-income students and children of color particularly hard if they don't have the resources to make up for lost time in the classroom and are more likely to face systemic barriers to getting to school – such as unreliable transportation, lack of access to health care, unstable or unaffordable housing, WHEREAS, chronic absence exacerbates the achievement gap that separates low-income students from their peers, since students from low-income families are both more likely to be chronically absent and more likely to be affected academically by missing school. Absenteeism also undermines efforts to improve struggling schools, since it's hard to measure improvement in classroom instruction if students are not in class to benefit from them, WHEREAS schools and community partners can reach out more frequently to absent students to determine why they are missing school and what would help them attend more regularly, WHEREAS schools and districts must do more to track, calculate and share the data on how many students are chronically absent so that we can deliver the right interventions to the right students, WHEREAS all students – even those who show up regularly – are affected by chronic absence because teachers must spend time reviewing for students who missed lessons, WHEREAS chronic absence can be significantly reduced when schools, parents and communities work together to monitor and promote good attendance and address hurdles that keep children from getting to school, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that as the Board of Education of Pueblo School District 60, we proclaim that our schools will stand with the nation in recognizing September as "Attendance Awareness Month." We hereby commit to focusing on reducing chronic absenteeism to give all children an equitable opportunity to learn, grow and thrive academically, emotional and socially.

9.0 REPORTS

2022-2023 Back to School Update

Assistant Superintendent Suzanne Morey stated that highlights from the opening of the 2022-2023 school year would be shared with the Board of Education. A video clip of the Pueblo Academy of Arts 6th Grade Orientation was shown. Assistant Superintendent Morey extended a special thank you to staff for planning the first day activities. Classroom environments were welcoming and engaged students in a positive mindset of success. Many parent volunteers also participated. Each year, the building hallways displayed schoolwide themes.

Executive Director Ted Johnson stated that school leaders also presented the theme, Building a Bridge of Brighter Days. Areas of improvement (Big Rocks) were identified and the change process will be supported. The K-12 Leadership Development Focus will be 'Leading Change' through simulations, practice activities, and collegial interaction. Mr. Johnson reported that new dean leadership will engage in year-long training through a model of the Emerging Leadership Program. Deans will also be provided with technical assistance and training.

Executive Director Andy Burns stated that the department received 3,100 open enrollment and School Choice requests (98% requests were honored). As of today, 215 student registrations are pending. The District will continue to monitor enrollment through the Enrollment Count period.

Assistant Superintendent Eric DeCesaro reported on staffing. With the current labor storage, it has been a difficult hiring season. There are 45 classified positions open at this time. Despite the challenges, it has been a successful hiring process. Human Resources continues to explore new ways to improve processes. The HR Department will continue to monitor the enrollment numbers and adjust staffing accordingly.

Director Kelly Warren stated that 75 new teachers were welcomed to the District. The in-person orientation was held at Centennial High School and participants were provided with a 'goody caddy' to assist in their first day of school. The District partnered with Sunwest Credit Union to provide lunches and received positive feedback. The New Teacher Mentor/Induction Grant was approved by the Colorado Department of Education. The grant will provide induction of TOSA support; mentor training, roving substitute, program planning, and implementation.

Assistant Superintendent Morey announced the first day of preschool students will be August 24, 2022. Schools are also preparing Back-to-School events and field trips are being conducted throughout the SY2022-2023. Athletics and other events are well-underway. In closing, it was evident that first day activities were organized and joyous. Superintendent Macaluso complimented the staff for a successful start of the new school year.

2023 Insurance Committee Report

Cameron Whiting, Director of Human Resources, presented a report to the Board of Education on the 2023 health, dental, and vision insurance options and premiums. Kaiser Permanente presented a health insurance renewal increase of 4.5%. Dental increase premiums were increased by 4.6%. Eye Med did not experience a rate increase. The District provides a life insurance program and additionally retiree life insurance. No increase in life insurance premiums. The Insurance Committee recommends that the Board of Education approves the 2022 insurance premium rates. Increased fertility benefits will be included in the renewal.

State of Grace will work with schools to provide a therapeutic vs punitive options for students who are having discipline issues. The services will include mentoring, individual and group counseling, family wrap-around services, and individualized counseling plans for students. This partnership will also support restorative justice opportunities as an alternative to out-of-school suspension.

The Pueblo Urban Renewal Authority, in carrying out the Urban Renewal Plan for the Saint Charles Industrial Park Urban Renewal Project, approved by the Pueblo City Council on December 21, 2008, and amended on April 18, 2022, has determined that any net TIF Revenues received by the Authority after Phase I public improvements and superior pledges of TIF Revenue are paid, will be applied to the beneficial application or direct payment to District 60. The Authority desires to apply those net TIF Revenues to public improvements in the form of repairs and maintenance at the Dutch Clark Stadium. The Authority will manage and supervise the project and has submitted an agreement to accomplish these purposes.
